- Eliminate two incorrect answers first.
- Always guess—there is no penalty for wrong answers.

Importance of Full-Length Practice Tests

- Simulates real test conditions.
- Helps build endurance and time management.

How to Review and Learn from Mistakes

- Categorize mistakes: Concept errors vs. careless errors.
- Re-attempt incorrect questions without looking at solutions first.

9. The Week Before the Digital SAT

What to Do in the Final Days Before the Test

- Take a light review session—avoid new topics.
- Get enough sleep to maintain focus.

Test Day Checklist: What to Bring & What to Avoid

Bring:

- Fully charged device (for Digital SAT)
- Photo ID and Admission Ticket
- Approved Calculator (if allowed)

Avoid:

- Smartwatches or unauthorized electronic devices
- Stress—stay relaxed and confident!
